Goal #1

Goal

Saint George Academy seeks to increase student performance in the language arts within the areas of writing and reading comprehension. Through the incorporation of student access to computer technology, we are seeking an overall increase in ELA proficiency. Our goal is to increase the number of students scoring 'proficient' or above on standardized assessments by 10 percent. Saint George Academy will utilize SY2021 funding for the purchase of Chromebooks (60 individual computers and accompanying storage/charging carts to be utilized exclusively in SGA's English and Language Arts classrooms. The intended application of these devices includes providing students the continual opportunity for long-form writing assignments, topical research as necessary, and student-student collaboration through web-based platforms.

Students' ELA performance is measured through 'in-house' assessment of ELA proficiency, as well as, annual statewide assessments (e.g. RISE - grade 8, ASPIRE - grades 9-11). In addition, SGA English faculty will measure the effectiveness of Chromebook utilization through formative assessments incorporating relevant foundational areas such as grammar, writing syntax, paragraph/essay production.

Action Plan Steps

Before the beginning of the SY 2021 academic year, SGA English faculty will expand on the current curricula to incorporate the availability of student Chromebook access. Once SY2021 funds have been released, computers will be purchased and employed beginning at the commencement of classes in the Fall 2021 semester. All students entering SGA in SY2021 will be assessed using an 'in-house' writing proficiency assessment to determine baseline ability and to ensure correct course placement. This assessment will be administered at least one more at the end of the academic year.

Goal #4

Goal

Saint George Academy seeks to increase student performance in the language arts within the areas of reading comprehension and literature analysis. Through the incorporation of in-class literature volumes, we are seeking an overall increase in ELA proficiency. Our goal is to increase the number of students scoring 'proficient' or above on standardized assessments by 10 percent. In addition, we are hoping to see an increase in ACT Writing and Science scores by an average of at least 2 points. The English and Language Arts Faculty (2 current and 1 anticipated new hire) seeks to create a library of literature texts to be employed throughout the ELA courses offered at Saint George Academy. Currently there are no classroom sets of volumes and students are provided with photocopies of sections deemed relevant to the individual instructor. The intended goal of incorporating selected texts will be to codify a program-wide ELA curricula that will introduce students to a specific canon of literature in effort to develop their capacity to promote reading comprehension, develop their ability literature and figurative language. Moreover, students will engage in reflective analyses of the ethics and values presented in the works and identify/present their own as they relate to the materials.

Students' ELA performance is measured through 'in-house' assessment of ELA proficiency, as well as, annual statewide assessments (e.g. RISE - grade 8, ASPIRE - grades 9-11). In addition, SGA English faculty will measure the effectiveness of the incorporation of specific works if literature and other volumes through students' capacity of reading comprehension through reflective written essays assessing their analyses of the literature and related content, as well as, student participation in Socratic seminars and online discussion fora.

Action Plan Steps

Before the beginning of the SY2021 academic year, SGA English faculty will expand on the current curricula to incorporate the availability of specific literature texts. Once SY2021 funds have been released, classroom sets of literature volumes will be purchased and employed beginning at the commencement of classes in the Fall 2020 semester. All students entering SGA in SY2021 will be assessed using an 'in-house' reading comprehension assessments to determine baseline ability and to ensure correct course placement. This assessment will be administered at least once more at the end of the academic year.
